Call Committee Update

The call committee recently compiled the congregational surveys. They used that information to fill out and submit our congregational profile which was submitted two weeks ago. The next steps are to make a slideshow highlighting our church, community, and surrounding areas to the candidates. After that the synod will start sending us candidates to interview for a possible call to Nazareth.

Virtual Synod Assembly Report

Charlotte Thiesse virtually attended the Western Iowa Synod Convention, April 9-10,2021. We thank her for doing this and representing Nazareth. Below you will find her summary of the event.

April 9 – All activities held virtually. Friday session was training for Saturday. We learned how to register and how to vote.

April 10 -8:30am start with Bishop Lorna Halaas presiding. She began with prayer. ELCA Bishop Elizabeth Eaton also sent greetings.

It was noted that there will be 28 congregations in our synod who will be in Call process as of this summer. 17 persons are now in candidacy...this includes our own Kim Campbell.

Pastor Harold Heinzig was honored for his 50 years of service.

Congregation anniversaries were noted from 5 to 150 years.

Christopher Otten spoke about the Chaplin ministry that is available.

Credentials Committee reported there were 194 persons in attendance – online.

Agenda was approved and secretary minutes from 2019 are posted online. (No convention last year due to Covid 19)

This is not a year to elect WIS Bishop – various other offices were filled by submitting a unanimous ballot.


Vote was approved amending two by-laws concerning terms of office. Amendments must be voted on two years in a row. These will be presented again next year.

Treasurer reported synod will need \$1.242.600 for budgeted items. Request is being made for one and one-half percent increase from each of the 125 congregations in Western Iowa Synod.

There are lots of ways the Synod helps congregations/groups/individuals. Nazareth has received money for the Food Pantry and Gifts for Kids.

Synod convention ended at 12:30 with Bishop Halaas giving the closing prayer. Charlotte Thiesse, Representative from Nazareth.

Wrapping Care Around Iowa Children

Martha and Marti first became foster parents in September of 2018, after their biological children expressed that they wanted to provide foster care as a family. They decided to become licensed through LSI Foster Care and Adoption and soon after, they welcomed a sibling group of three into their home.

"Our kids really wanted to look into foster care as a way to be able to help others as a family," Martha says. "Everybody had to sacrifice and pour in, and everybody was needed and brought something to the table."

The siblings stayed with the family for almost two years, until the opportunity came for them to find a forever home through adoption. Over the years, the siblings had become bonded to Martha and Marti, as well as their extended family and friends. The siblings are currently in the process of officially being adopted by a family close to Martha and Marti, so they can continue to stay connected to the important relationships they built in foster care. The family has found a passion they can all share, and it's making a difference in the lives of Iowa children.

"We always explain fostering as 'good' and 'hard.' You never want to take one away from the other, because it's both. It's the hardest thing we've ever done, but it's the best thing we've done," Martha says. "We've had the privilege of having the kids in our home and you have the responsibility and the privilege to take care of them in their time of need."
