I want to highlight some important dates happening in September at Nazareth ... **September 3:** 6:30 PM Parent/Youth meeting for confirmation youth at Nazareth. 7<sup>th</sup> graders will receive their Bibles at this time.

**September 10:** Confirmation starts at Nazareth. This is held for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders from both Nazareth & United. Please note that there are some changes for this year: As in the past, youth will gather at Nazareth following school and sports practice. They are invited to bring their own snack items (chips, popcorn, crackers, etc. and a drink) to eat until class starts. (There will not be a meal served.) Class will be held in the double Sunday school room from 5:30pm-6:30pm.

October 1: BLAST begins at Nazareth. This is a community outreach for youth PreK – 6<sup>th</sup> grade. It is held after school on North Union early out days. Students have a snack, engage in a Bible lesson and a coordinating activity. Youth can be picked up at 4:00pm. On this first day they will have Blessing of Backpacks.

<u>October 5</u>: Sunday School starts at Nazareth from 10:15-11 AM upstairs in the double Sunday school room following snack in the fellowship hall after service; additionally Blessing of Backpacks will be held during the service.

On Tues. Sept. 4<sup>th</sup> from 4-6 PM the Food bank will be held at the Good News Church in Estherville. In August, 518 individuals (177 families) received 12,000 lbs. of food. The Food Bank of Iowa partners with 700 agencies in 55 counties to distribute 2.5 million pounds of food each month so that no one goes hungry in Iowa!

### Online Donations

If you would like to give to NLC but would like an automated option, try Give Plus+! This online option has been available for our church. Simply do the following:

- 1. Go to our website (<a href="www.nazlutheran.com">www.nazlutheran.com</a>)
- 2. Click the 'Nazareth' Tab in the top banner
- 3. Click the yellow "Give Plus+Donation" button under the picture
- 4. The 'GivePlus+' page will open. At this point you will add your contributions to your 'cart'. You can choose between our general fund, building endowment, memorials or a special project. If you choose to give to more than one fund you just add them individually to your cart.
- 5. Select contribute
- 6. Set up one time or a reoccurring donation
- 7. Click add to basket
- 8. Repeat steps 5-7 to contribute to other funds.
- 9. Continue to payment screen
- 10. Choose between credit, debit or back account payment
- 11. At this point you can choose to help offset fees by clicking the slider to turn that option on or off. To help you get the most donation credit, we suggest leaving that slider off and just up your donation by .50-1.00 (depending on your giving amount).
- 12. Click the "continue to review" button
- 13. Next screen gives you an overview of your contribution breakdown for each fund
- 14. Click submit.
